Name of WG/Network	Working Group on Structural Funds IV
Purpose/Mandate	In 2008, the Contact Committee tasked the Working Group on Structural Funds to continue its reviews of Structural Funds issues and specifically to carry out an audit on "costs of controls of Structural Funds". The Contact Committee welcomed the Working Group's intention to submit the report on this audit to the Contact Committee in 2011 at the latest.
Status/Outcome/ Results in 2011	The Working Group adopted a common audit plan and an audit schedule. The field work for the parallel audit started in June 2009 and lasted until September 2010, resp. end of 2010. From January 2011 until March 2011 the Core Group compiled a draft composite report. The Working Group adopted the draft composite report, its draft resolution and the possible topic for a Working Group V (2012/2013). In October 2011 the Working Group will present its draft composite report, its draft resolution and the possible topic for a Working Group V (2012/2013) to the Contact Committee.

Activity Plan for 2012

- To continue the work on adequacy and feasibility of VAT gap estimates according to the top-down methodology applied by Reckon and based on national *relevés* data.
- To address the question of distinct quantification of VAT gap components, focusing on fraud.
- To review and assess methodologies and requirements to measure results of policies and actions aimed at fighting against VAT evasion/fraud.
- To review and assess risk management procedures applied to information received from the taxpayers after registration.
- To suggest that SAIs plan parallel audits to evaluate methodologies adopted by Member States to estimate the hidden economy and tax evasion/fraud and to construct the national relevé.
- To further observe the evolution of an Anti-VAT Fraud Strategy at EU level and ensure an adequate and up-to-date reporting on it.
- To continue with the topic "risk management" by investigating risk management procedures applied to information received from taxpayers after registration.
- To make the Core Group Reports available on the restricted CIRCA site and, where appropriate, communicate them to the relevant national administrations.
- To present the findings at the next VAT Working Group meeting in 2012/2013.

Purpose/Mandate	Originally a Candidate Countries Working Group set up to promote and facilitate small-scale, practical, hands-on cooperation between Candidate Country and EU Member State SAIs, the (renamed) Joint Working Group on Audit Activities (JWGAA) was established in 2002. The 2004 Contact Committee confirmed the JWGAA as a key element of the post-May 2004 EU enlargement framework with a mandate to contribute to maintaining the working links and cooperation between the SAIs of the Contact Committee and the Presidents' Network (Candidate and potential Candidate countries). JWGAA Chairs provide the Contact Committee with an annual report on the level and nature of all small scale audit activities.

- hosting and technical/professional/organisational support to Networks' training activity on Audit Quality (Prague, spring 2012);
- facilitating communication and assistance between European Commission, Contact Committee SAIs and Network for activities concerning performance auditing;
- facilitating Contact Committee support to specific Network meetings, projects or initiatives (e.g. Conference on the importance of enhancing constructive relations between SAIs and parliaments, as well as other bodies of the public administration);
- report to the 2012 Contact Committee (to be held in Lisbon).

Name of WG/Network	Network on National SAI Reports on EU Financial Management
Purpose/Mandate	The Network aims to exchange information on EU financial management and to discuss what can be done in and with (overall) EU reports in order to enhance development of common elements in these reports (thereby enabling country comparisons). Ideally this could result in specific activities being undertaken by more or less independent subgroups of interested members. The Network uses its parts on the Contact Committee website as its main platform for information exchange.
Status/Outcome/ Results in 2011	The progress that SAIs have been making in developing overall reports on EU financial management has continued in 2011. Thirteen SAIs have by now produced an (annual) overall EU report. This year, the Network has focused its activities on two aspects: • to identify research areas in which SAIs are willing and able to cooperate in order to produce common elements in their respective reports on EU financial management. So far, three groups of interested SAIs have been formed who are currently exploring the activities they may undertake in their respective fields of interest; • in close cooperation with the European Court of Auditors, a new design for the website has been made so it may indeed function as the main vehicle for the exchange of information on EU financial management and means of communication for the subgroups working on common elements in their overall reports.

Activities this year (meetings etc.)	In 2011, no meeting has taken place. A meeting is however planned on 2 and 3 February 2012 in Copenhagen, Denmark. The title of the seminar is EU audit in action: Comparing national risk assessments and looking at what's next. The purpose of the seminar is twofold: • to gain new common insight into the development of EU financial management through an exchange of experience on the SAIs' assessment of risk in national management of central EU programs, i.e. agricultural and structural funds; • to update Network members on recent developments in the field of EU financial management and EU auditing. Apart from the regular members of the Network, EU auditors of national SAIs will be invited.

Name of WG/Network	Agricultural Experts Network
Purpose/Mandate	The purpose of the Network is to exchange operational and professional information between Supreme Audit Institutions and the European Court of Auditors (ECA). Its aim is to involve in particular those dealing directly with the audit of agricultural funds of the European Union.
Status/Outcome/ Results in 2011	A meeting of the Network was held in October 2010 in Prague, coinciding with the joint training event of the Contact Committee and the EUROSAI on auditing the CAP, which was organised by the Czech SAI and the ECA. It was agreed that: • the Network continues to be relevant to inform members of recent developments; • to achieve the objectives set, however, it is necessary for all members to become more proactive in exchanging information; • an annual meeting is considered helpful, but the most appropriate forum should be carefully considered; • setting up a discussion forum is considered useful to exchange information on instructions, guidelines, etc. relating to CAP controls. The following course of action was proposed: • to reactivate the Network around the theme of the CAP policies post-2013; • to investigate the setting-up of a discussion forum; • to reflect on the most appropriate forum for regular meetings to take place as well as the most appropriate timeframe (annual/biannual meetings); • to revert to members with concrete proposals to put such changes into effect.

Activities this year (meetings, etc.)	 The CIRCA system is currently being revamped to make it more modern and easier to use; following this update, it is planned to make the Network more user-friendly. The ECA is currently developing an Extranet. Once implemented, it is planned to migrate the Network from CIRCA to this Extranet.

Purpose/Mandate	 The Fiscal Policy Audit Network was founded in 2008 (Contact Committee Resolution CC-R-2008-4), based on a joint activity proposal presented by the SAIs of Finland and Sweden. The CC Resolution CC-R-2009-03 further recognized the Network. The purpose of the Network is:
	 improving methodologies and practices in auditing national fiscal policy, by making use of best practice and sharing of information between SAIs active in this subject area;
	 constituting a network of practitioners and sharing information with SAIs interested in the subject area.
	• The activities of the Network cover benchmarking (best practices, gathering data), information sharing and organising workshops and seminars to disseminate the available information on Fiscal Policy Audit related topics.
Status/Outcome/ Results in 2011	• The Network's focus is clearly on developing best practice and information exchange. The Network serves as a forum for fiscal policy audit professionals, with the aim to share methodological questions and know-how.
	 The annual seminars have served as a fruitful meeting point for practitioners from different SAIs. The seminars have covered a range of themes, from discussing audit methodology to presenting various audit results or audit topics. The participation in seminars has been good.
	• Today, the objective to gather a data-bank on Fiscal Policy audit related material has not yet been successfully met.
	• The original ideas included a Network report on the information distributed within the Network (methodology, audit results, audit topics), a seminar to be organised for a wider audience (SAIs not currently working on this theme) and potential parallel audits.

Activities this year (meetings etc.)	Fiscal Policy Network Work Forum in Stockholm 5-6 May 2011 The Swedish Superior Audit Institution, Riksrevision, hosted the third Fiscal Policy Network Workshop in Stockholm on the 5-6 May 2011. Participants from the European Court of Auditors and 17 EU SAIs working on Fiscal Policy related themes took part in the discussions around three themes: Fiscal Policy Audit, the European Audit Structure, Tax Policy Audit. The discussions covered Fiscal Policy audit reports, audit methodology, audit on tax policy, and the risks and challenges linked to the European Stability Mechanism (ESM) and the EFSF.

The main themes and activities of the Network will be the following: • Network will follow the developments concerning the role and practises of SAIs in European Semester and in the revised system of economic governance, and raise, if needed, attention of the Contact Committee on the matter. Particularly, the follow-up of the issues discussed in the Contact Committee Seminar on the European Semester and EU economic governance, held on 13th October 2011; • the main theme of the Network will be sovereign debt crisis and the assurance of the information on the financial position of the Government and state and development of public finances; • European Union stabilisation measures. Network is looking for interested SAIs to organise a seminar in 2012. Cour des Comptes has expressed its preliminary willingness to host a seminar in Paris in Spring 2012.
