Sustainable development requires effective, accountable and inclusive institutions – SDG #16




UN recognises the direct and positive impact of SAIs on good governance and accountability

SAIs reports enable stakeholders to take informed decisions and enforce accountability



INTOSAI supports SAI development through professional standards, capacity building & knowledge sharing



The CBC is the strategic driver of capacity building in developing country SAIs, especially fragile & post-conflict countries




SAI performance measurement is important, also as a key tool to identify development needs



2014 global SAI stocktake indicates progress, but still a long way to go

Key considerations for effective development

- 
- Country-specific, needs-driven & leadership supported programmes
 - Effective needs assessment & performance measurement tools
 - Sustainability must be a key focus of development efforts
 - Structured, coordinated multiple stakeholder cooperation
 - Peer-to-peer valuable self-sufficient approach
 - Linking in with existing programmes promotes wider development
